Children also reflected upon people in their lives, things they have lost and how to deal with problems.




We like to tackle key issues by addressing modern British Values.

Art, design and working with experts - we give the children the opportunity to work with a range of professionals in developing our social and historical cultural awareness. Look at our beautiful banner that was created.


