

Year 3 Homework Challenges – Summer 2 2021

Read the activities below and choose one to complete for your homework each week. You are expected to complete one per week, although you can complete more if you want to! Some activities will not take long to complete. Some might need more thinking and research and will be more of a challenge to complete. You CANNOT complete the same task more than once!

Dojo points will be awarded based on the value of the activity and the quality of your work!

A clear photo or video of your homework must be handed in on Class Dojo every Thursday, ready to be shared in class. There will be a task set in your portfolio every week for you to add a photograph to and the previous week will be archived.

<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 2 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Complete a session on TTRockstars. You must complete the whole session for it to count as completed homework. New sessions will be set each week.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 2 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Draw a detailed sketch of a vase from Ancient Greece.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 2 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Ask an adult to help you conduct an investigation into objects that sink or float. You could draw or write your results or take a photo of your investigation.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 3 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Make a model of a 3D shape - or more than one if you wish! Materials such as straws, lolly sticks, pipe cleaners, blu-tac and playdough work well for this.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 3 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Learn a poem off by heart ready to recite to the class. It can be any poem you wish; if it's linked to our topic, even better!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 3 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Interview a friend or family member to find out about their job. What interesting information can you find out? Remember to write down your questions and their answers!</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 4 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Write a description of a Cyclops. Remember to use lots of fantastic adjectives and expanded noun phrases to describe the Cyclops – you could even draw them too!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 4 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Ask an adult to help you do some cooking or baking so that you can practise your measuring skills. Can you measure all of the ingredients accurately in grams, kilograms, millilitres or litres?</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 4 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Conduct some research into one of the Ancient Greek gods and write a fact file about them.</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 5 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Make a model of a labyrinth (a labyrinth is like a maze from Ancient Greece). You can make your model using any materials you wish, such as paper and card, sand, papier-mâché or Lego.</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 5 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Write your own Ancient Greek myth. You could take inspiration from myths such as <i>Theseus and the Minotaur</i>, <i>King Midas</i>, <i>Heracles</i> (sometimes called <i>Hercules</i>) or any others you can think of!</p>	<p style="text-align: center;"><u>Up to 5 Dojo Points</u></p> <p>Create your own mini-Olympics for you and your family to take part in. The sporting activities can be anything you like, but the more events you plan and complete, the more Dojo points you will get!</p>
