### The importance of READING

The greatest gift we can give every child is the ability to read. It opens the door to so many opportunities! With this in mind, we are working hard to develop a culture of reading for every child in Silver Tree Primary School.

Reading at home—Every child in our school needs to practise their reading at home. Those who are still learning need to practise their new skills regularly to ensure they improve. ## Starting School

Will your child turn 5 between 1 September 2024 and 31 August 2025?

If so, you need to complete an application online to tell us which school you would like your child to attend from September 2024.

Visit www.durham.gov.uk/primaryschoolplaces where you can access a useful guide to help with your application. The easiest way to apply is online, if you are unable to apply online, paper application forms are available on request

You still need to apply even if your child attends the nursery unit attached to the school, or already has a sibling at the school. You will also need to apply for a place in Year 3 in a junior school for an older child.

Applications open 5 September 2023 and close midnight 15 January 2024.

#### **NURSERY SESSIONS**

Currently, we have spaces available in our beautiful Nursery. Please let family and friends know if they have children who are nearly three years old—we are happy to arrange a visit to see the amazing indoor and outdoor provision and meet our friendly staff. If you use our Nursery and would like to access additional sessions, these are also available. The cost is £12 per session and there is an additional charge for lunch. Please do not hesitate to make contact with our school office if you need more than your allocated 15 hours.

If there is more than two interested people, there will be a ballot for all parents to vote in to see who our parent governors will be.




#### **PARKING AND DRIVING ON SITE**
